### DETAILED PROPOSAL FOR A SKILLS BUILDING WORKSHOP ON OCTOBER 26<sup>TH</sup> 2017

<b>WORKSHOP TITLE</b>	Focus on the Future by Strengthening Adolescent Health Training
<b>RATIONALE</b>	<p>Training on comprehensive adolescent health will be essential to ensure that adolescents and youth will receive high quality health care. This workshop will address training at several levels, including pre-service training for high level health professionals, in-service training for frontline health workers, and empowering youth leaders as health advocates at the community and at national levels. The workshop will build skills for the participants by reviewing global, online tools and resources that address adolescent health. The workshop will focus on cost-effective approaches that can be applied to low resource settings. Participants will be able to identify at least two strategies they can apply to their programs that will strengthen adolescent health training, to build a sustainable, multi-disciplinary adolescent health team.</p>

<b>Training objectives</b>	<p>1. Participants will be able to analyse current challenges in adolescent health training in their respective countries and outline essential components of a multidisciplinary training curriculum</p>

	<p>2. Participants will be able to identify at least one resource and course for adolescent health training conducted by professional organizations, to be used at the pre-service and in-service levels</p> <p>3. Participants will describe at least two training strategies that will support goals of the Global Strategy for Adolescent Health and elaborate on a multimodal interactive online and offline teaching strategy using available global and WHO tools</p> <p>4. Participants will be able to learn skills to facilitate youth participation and leadership and to evaluate levels of youth participation as a component of adolescent health training. They will also be able to plan strategies for partnering with parents and teachers.</p> <p>5. Participants will formulate a plan to promote partnership and information exchange regarding successful adolescent health training</p>
<p><b>Facilitation techniques</b></p>	<p>The workshop will outline strategies for adolescent health training and future partnerships at national and global levels, structured to strengthen adolescent health training. The facilitation techniques will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Interactive presentations with PowerPoint slides beginning with the current status of training in various parts of the world, effective training tools in adolescent health, examples reflecting the impact of pre-service and in-service trainings and youth leadership as a component of adolescent health training</li> <li>• Use of examples and teaching strategies provided by the participants</li> <li>• Small group work on designing course curriculum and teaching strategies for professionals and youth; participants will also evaluate and demonstrate adolescent health training</li> <li>• Use of a video and role plays</li> </ul>
